

**Report of the Growth of the National Board Program in Illinois
National Board Resource Center at Illinois State University
July 31, 2008**

Monitoring the growth of the numbers of candidates and National Board Certified Teachers (NBCTs) may be shown through different lenses. The Illinois State Board of Education reports the data through the fiscal year that begins July 1 of one year and ends June 30 of the next year. The National Board for Professional Teaching Standards (NBPTS) schedules registration from January 1 through December 31 in one year. The candidate may participate in the program from January 1 through December and continue through the process until the middle of June of the following year to equal about 1 ½ years to complete the process.

Most Illinois candidates apply to NBPTS in the late spring of one fiscal year and complete the process in the next fiscal year during the school year from August through the following June. Added to the complexity is that candidates apply to NBPTS but not to the state for the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy, and conversely, candidates apply to the state for the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy but not to NBPTS. Some candidates are approved for the state fee but do not follow-through to pay the initial \$500 fee so they do not receive the state fee but these candidates remain on the NBPTS website. Some candidates withdraw officially from NBPTS or the state and some are forcibly withdrawn from NBPTS when they do not make the payments by the due date.

This report will show the growth of NBCTs and candidates through both lenses: the ISBE fiscal year and the NBPTS cycle. The data will be provided in multiple ways to show the number of participants in the Illinois National Board Program: newly named NBCTs, total NBCTs, candidates, retake candidates, and TAKE ONE candidates. Data will show activity in each Illinois region and in the 29 identified counties with no NBCTs in 2007 and will show candidates in schools on the Academic Watch Status (AWS), Academic Early Warning Status (AEWS) and with 50% or more students on free and reduced cost lunch.

Overview of the Growth of Candidates and NBCTs.

Since FY01, the Illinois State Board of Education identified numbers of NBCTs and candidates to show the growth of the Illinois National Board Program by fiscal year. This chart was taken from the RFSP in October 2007 and the numbers for FY08 were revised to reflect the number of candidates for whom ISBE paid the \$2,000 Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy to NBPTS.

1,444 candidates received the Illinois NBPTS Candidate Fee Subsidy as new candidates in FY08 with 313 candidates from July 1 through December 2007 and 1,131 candidates from January 1 through June 30, 2008.

Goals, Actions, and Results for the Growth of the Illinois National Board Program

In the 2007 RFSP, the goal for the ISBE National Board Program in FY08 was “the recruitment of no fewer than 1,000 candidates into the National Board certification process who, according to the database, have not participated in the process in any prior year. To be counted toward the achievement of this goal, each candidate must teach either in a targeted school or in another public school located in one of the 29 counties where there are currently no NBCTs employed. “Targeted schools include schools on the Academic Early Warning Status (AEWS), Academic Watch Status (AWS), or schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch or from the 29 counties with no NBCTs in October 2007.

Services

To meet these goals, the NBCTs in the Illinois NBPTS Comprehensive Support System partnered with NBCTs, ROEs/ISCs, and school districts in all regions of the state to arrange services to recruit and support candidates in targeted schools and counties. NBCTs conducted 33 summits for over 300 NBCTs to share procedures, materials, professional opportunities, training schedules, and opportunities to create plans to recruit and support candidates particularly in targeted schools and counties. The NBCT Regional and Local Coordinators identified 177 schools in AWS, 234 schools in AEWS, 693 schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch, and 85 schools in counties with no NBCTs. They solicited NBCTs throughout the state and arranged 118 awareness presentations to 1,328 teachers with 104 of the presentations to 888 teachers in targeted schools and 13 presentations to 120 teachers in counties with no NBCTs (Appendix A). Additional awareness presentations were arranged with NBCTs

beyond the targeted schools. The NBCT Regional and Local Coordinators arranged the following support services for candidates: 24 Assessment Center Cohorts for 288 candidates, thirteen Jumpstart sessions for 165 candidates, 49 candidate cohorts for 500 candidates, and three TAKE ONE cohorts for 45 candidates. The NBCT leaders also arranged training for 135 NBCTs through one NBCT Candidate Mentor Training and eight TAKE ONE Candidate Mentor Trainings (Appendix A).

Communication

To support Illinois teachers to make the decision to seek National Board Certification, staff at the National Board Resource Center at Illinois State University and the NBCT Regional and Local Coordinators communicated with NBCTs, ROEs/ISCs, teachers, administrators, and potential candidates. Regional NBCTs e-mailed or phoned almost 15,000 teachers and over 1,000 administrators (Appendix B). Their e-mails and flyers were mass e-mailed to almost 65,000 teachers and administrators through networks and communication systems of regional listservs, IEA, IFT, IPA, IASA, and ROEs/ISCs. Staff at the NBRC sent blast emails to the 2,000+ Illinois NBCTs, 1,131 candidates, and potential candidates. Almost 2,000 emails were sent to respond to candidates and potential candidates and over 600 calls were made or received from candidates to share information about the application process, NBPTS process, or support those trying to make decisions about candidacy (Appendix B).

Increase in Numbers of Candidates in Targeted Schools

As a result of strategic planning, communication, partnering, arranging services, and meeting with NBCTs in each region and local area, 1,131 candidates received the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy with 654 candidates or 58% of candidates from targeted schools and counties. This builds on the work in Fall 2007, when 222 candidates from targeted schools received the Subsidy. Likewise, the combination of the 313 Fall 2007 candidates and 1,131 Spring 2008 applicants equals 1,444 candidates with 876 candidates or 61% of the candidates in FY08 teaching in targeted schools (Appendix C). 431 of these 876 candidates teach in schools on AWS and 186 candidates teach in schools on AEWS. 677 candidates teach in schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch and 15 taught in counties with no NBCTs. The data shows that 876 of the FY08 candidates teach in schools under one of the categories for a targeted school. Almost 100% of Chicago candidates in targeted schools teach in schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch. Like Chicago, most teachers identified in targeted schools in Regions 3 through 6 teach in schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch. This differs from Regions 1 and 2 with a larger number of candidates in schools with AEWS or

AWS. Though 41% of the teachers in Region 1 were identified as teaching in targeted schools, 32 % of the Region 1 candidates teach in schools with AEWS or AWS. Most of these teachers teach in high schools. Only 15% of Region 1 candidates teach in schools with 50% or more students on free or reduced cost lunch.

Increase in Candidates and NBCTs in 29 Counties with No NBCTs in October 2007

Progress was made toward the goal of recruiting and supporting candidates within the 29 counties with no NBCTs (Appendix D). Sixteen of the 511 newly named NBCTs in November 2007 were from ten of these counties leaving only 19 counties with no NBCTs. Candidates were recruited in these counties for both the 2007/2008 and the 2008/2009 NBPTS cycle. In the 2007/2008 cycle, seventeen first-time candidates, 17 retake candidates, and 3 TAKE ONE candidates were from ten of these counties. In the spring window of the 2008/2009 NBPTS cycle, sixteen first-time candidates and seven TAKE ONE candidates were from ten of these counties. Only ten counties remain that do not have candidates or NBCTs. Many of these counties have only one school district. The NBCT Regional and Local Coordinators and NBCTs in neighboring counties have begun to communicate with school district teachers and administrators in these counties and will continue to target schools in these ten counties and the other 19 counties to continue to increase the number of NBCTs (Appendices D-G).

Comparison of Numbers of Candidates over Two Years

Each of the Illinois six regions increased the number of candidates in the FY08 Spring Window. Though numbers of candidates in Chicago Public Schools decreased from 409 in Spring 2007 to 314 in Spring 2008, the overall number of candidates for the state increased from 860 in Spring 2007 to 1,131 in Spring 2008. Not only did each of the Regions 1 through 6 increase over their Spring 2007 numbers of candidates, but each region recruited more candidates in Spring 2008 than were recruited in both Spring and Fall 2007 in the NBPTS registration cycle (Appendix H). These numbers will increase even more in the 2008-2009 NBPTS cycle if there is a Fall 2008 window for Illinois teachers to apply for the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy (Appendix H - J). In addition, 139 Illinois teachers applied for the NBPTS TAKE ONE Process from each region (Appendix K-L).

Illinois NBCTs

In November 2007, NBPTS announced that 511 newly named NBCTs taught in Illinois. This ranked Illinois fourth in the nation in the number of newly named NBCTs and eighth in the nation with a total of

2,492 NBCTs. This was an 8.6% increase over 2006 with a 500% increase in the number of NBCTs from 2002 to 2006 (Appendix M and N). The number of NBCTs has consistently grown since the NBPTS cycle in 1993/1994 when the first four Illinois NBCTS were announced (Appendix O).

Of the 2,492 Illinois NBCTs, Region 1 currently has 950 NBCTS comprising 38% of the total NBCTs with Chicago Public Schools (CPS) with 845 NBCTs comprising 34% of the total Illinois NBCTs. Together both Region 1 and CPS account for 72% of the total number of NBCTs in Illinois. Each of Regions 2, 3, 4, and 5 have a range of 6% to 8% of NBCTs and Region 6 has only 2% of the NBCTs (Appendix P & Q). This trend continued with the regional numbers for the 511 newly named NBCTs in 2007. Chicago edged Region 1 with 41% to 31% respectively but these two sites again accounted for 72% of the newly named 2007 NBCTs. Regions 2-6 ranged from 8% to 2% of the newly named NBCTs in their regions.

Illinois NBCTs may apply for the Illinois Teaching Excellence Funds' \$3,000 stipend and compensation for mentoring and providing professional development activities. In FY08, 2,080 Illinois NBCTs received the \$3,000 stipend which was an increase of 417 over the 1,663 NBCTs receiving the stipend in FY07. The number of Illinois NBCTs who submitted documentation for mentor/professional development compensation increased by 169 NBCTs with 460 Illinois NBCTs in FY08 receiving compensation for mentoring and professional development over the 291 NBCTs in FY07.

School Districts—NBCTs and Candidates

Twenty school districts have 4% or more of their teaching population certified as National Board Certified Teachers (Appendix R). Sixty percent of the districts are in Region 1 and three districts in Region 5 have more than 8% of their teachers certified as NBCTs (Bond County CUSD 2, Highland CUSD 5, and O'Fallon TWP HSD 203) Region 4 has four districts (Charleston CUSD 1, Bloomington SD 87, Urbana SD 116, and McLean County CUSD 5) and Region 2 has Sterling CUSD 5 with more than 4% of teachers certified as NBCTs.

Illinois has 2,492 NBCTs. Chicago Public Schools maintains the highest number of NBCTs in the state with 845 followed by Indian Prairie CUSD 204 with 86, Palatine CCSD 15 with 81, and Township HSD 211 with 73 (Appendix S). All other Regions except Region 6 have a school district with 10 or more NBCTs. Region 4 has six districts, Regions 5 and 3 have three districts each, and Region 2 has two districts.

Thirty-nine school districts in all regions of Illinois had groups of six or more candidates receive the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy in Spring 2008. Chicago Public Schools led with 314 candidates. The seventeen St. Charles CUSD 303 NBCTs recruited 80 candidates and the three Niles TWP CHSD 219 NBCTs recruited 31 candidates. Other districts that increased their numbers of candidates in groups for the first time in Spring 2008 included the following:

Hinsdale CCSD 181, Glenbard TWP HSD 87, Effingham CUSD 40, Galesburg CUSD 205, Marquardt SD15, Honoegah CHD 207, Bourbonnais SD53, Cahokia CUSD 187, Illinois School for the Deaf, Thornton Fractional TWP HSD 215, Carlyle CUSD 1, Marion CUSD 2, Arcola CUSD 306, Proviso TWP HSD 209 Bradley SD 61, Bureau Valley CUSD 340, Canton Union SD66, Illinois School for the Visually Impaired, Illini Bluffs CUSD 327, Iroquois West CUSD 10, Mattoon CUSD 2, MID-Valley Special Ed Co-op, Monmouth-Rossville CUSD 238, and Roxana CUSD 1 and others.

Candidates from other districts that had not participated in the National Board Program also applied. This list of districts represents each region and shows the growth of NBCT groups in districts where there were few or no NBCTs and where NBCTs recruited candidates into support groups (Appendix T).

Summary

The NBCT Regional and Local Coordinators in the Illinois NBPTS Comprehensive Support System partnered with NBCTs, ROEs/ISCs, and school district administrators to strategically plan, communicate, arrange, and offer services to recruit teachers in targeted schools. The National Board Resource Center at Illinois State University staff communicated with educational leaders, NBCTs, candidates, ROEs/ISCs, and administrators to support Illinois teachers to complete the process for applying to NBPTS and ISBE for the Illinois Candidate Fee Subsidy. The number of Illinois candidates and NBCTs increased in numbers in Regions 1-6 and Chicago Public Schools continues to lead in the number of NBCTs and continues to recruit hundreds of candidates. The increases in candidates can be seen in comparison of FY07 and FY08 and between the 2007-2008 and Spring 2008-2009 NBPTS cycle. Each of Regions 1 through 6 showed an increase in candidates, and many teachers from districts new to NBPTS applied in Spring 2008 and will be working in school or district groups. The reports on new NBCTs and FY08 candidates showed a decrease in the number of counties with no NBCTs and showed an increase in activity in those counties. Over 1,444 candidates were recruited in FY08 and 876 or 61% of the candidates taught in targeted schools in October 2007.

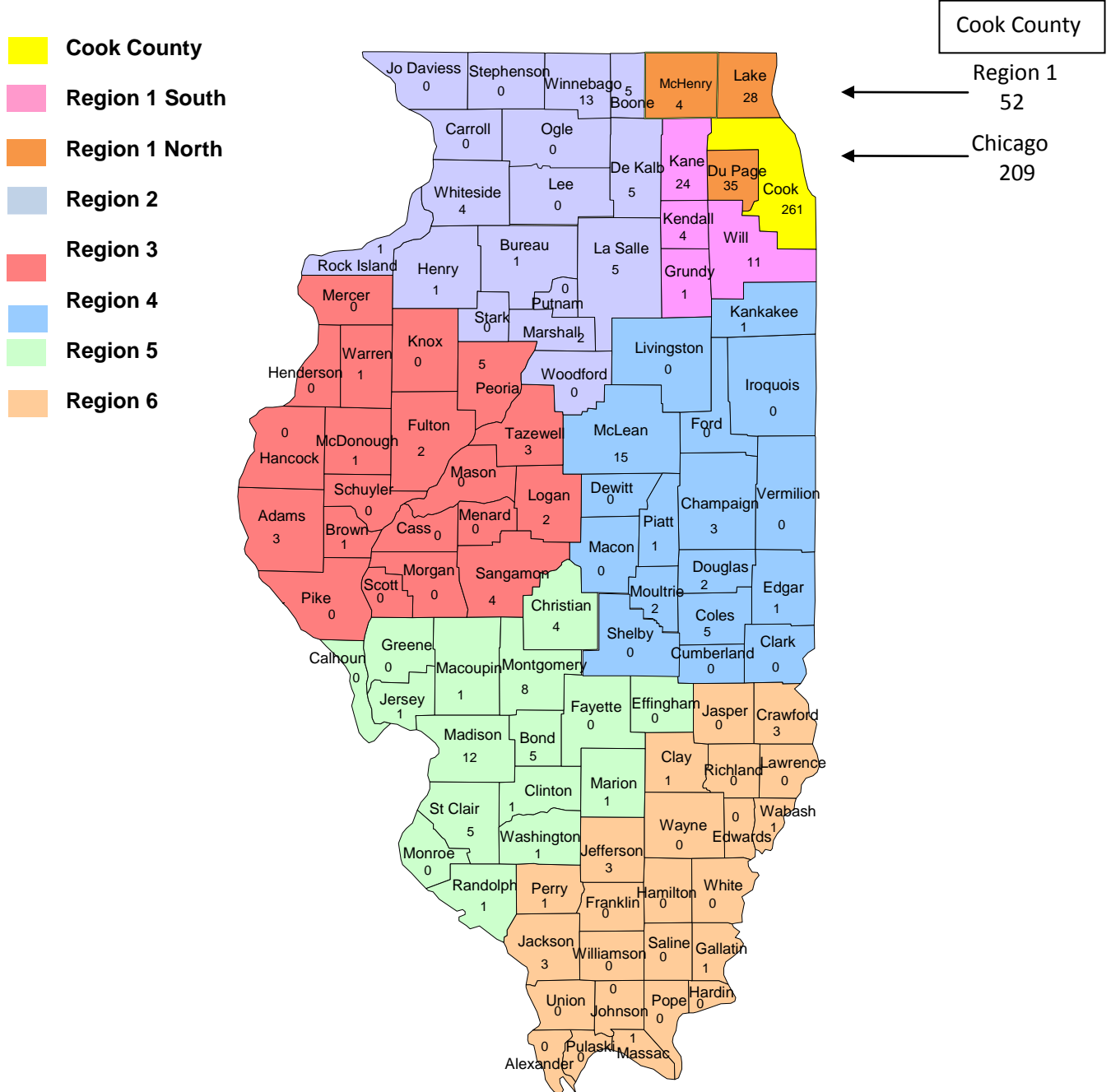

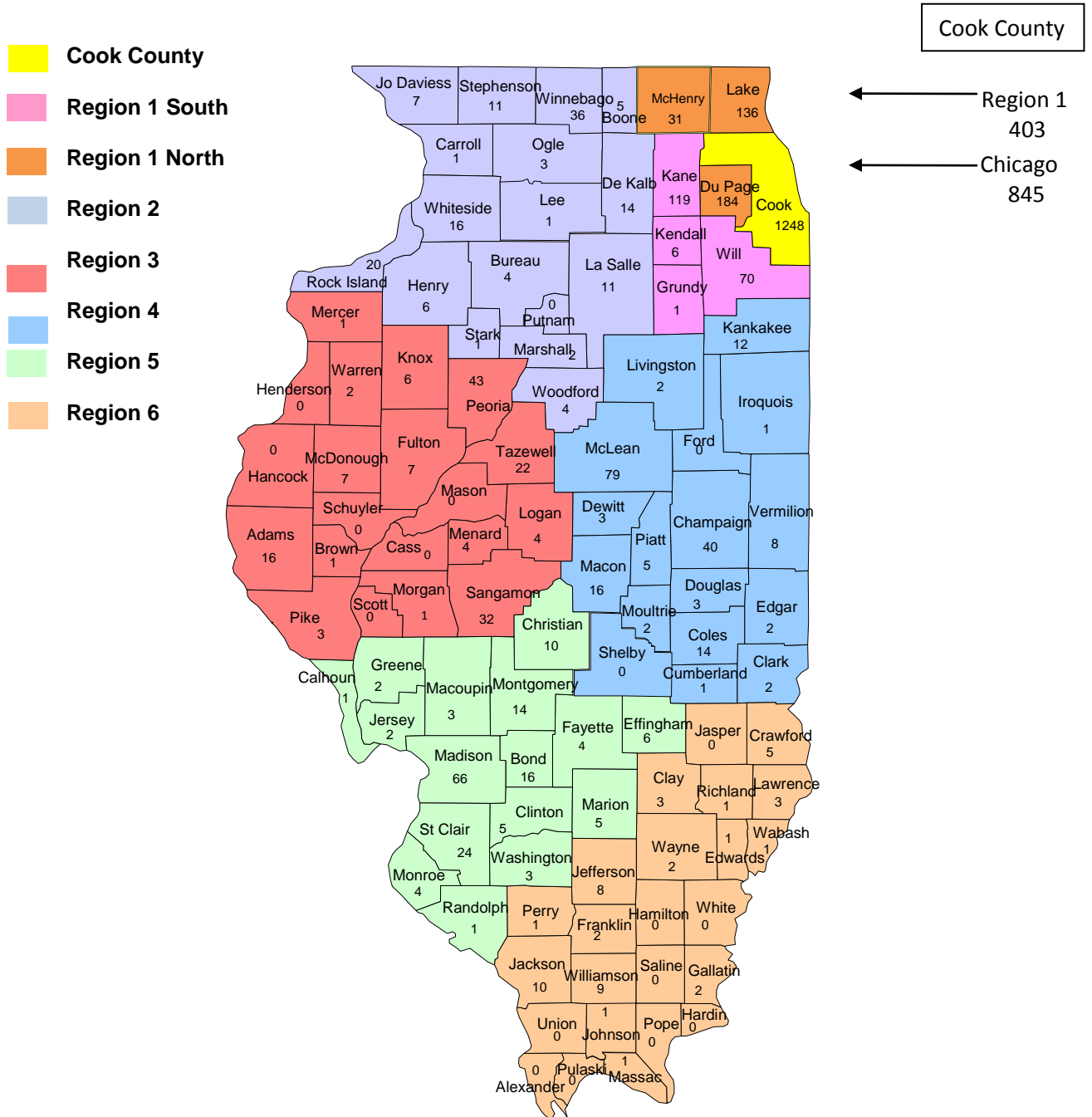

DECEMBER 2007 Total Illinois NBCTs 2,492 NBCTs



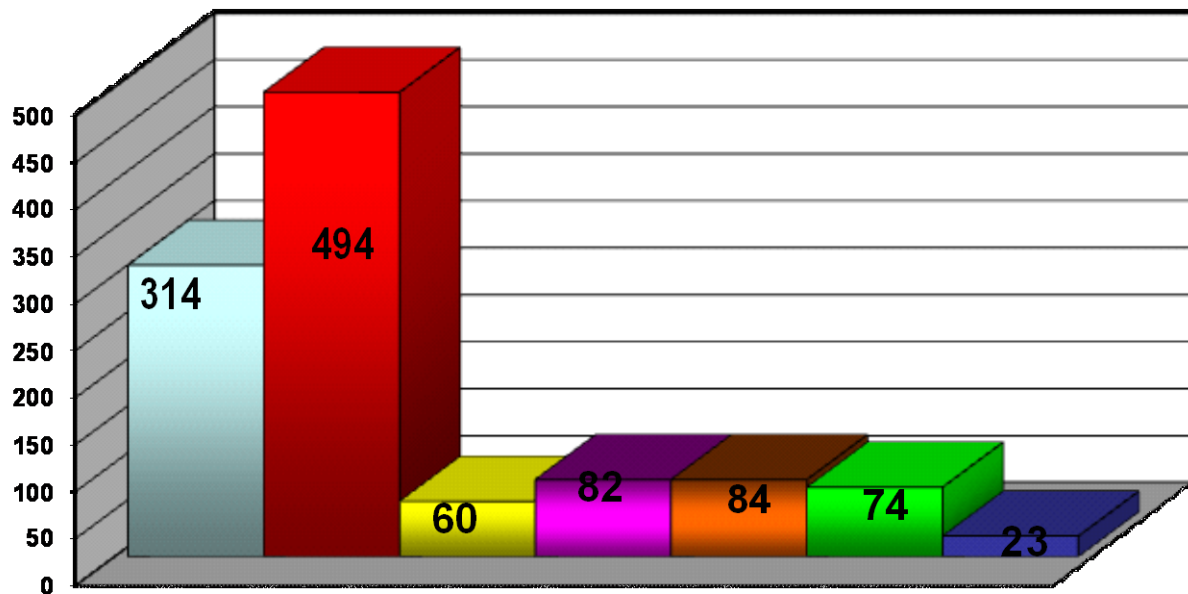

2008-2009 Illinois 1st Time Candidates by Region (Spring Window FY 08)



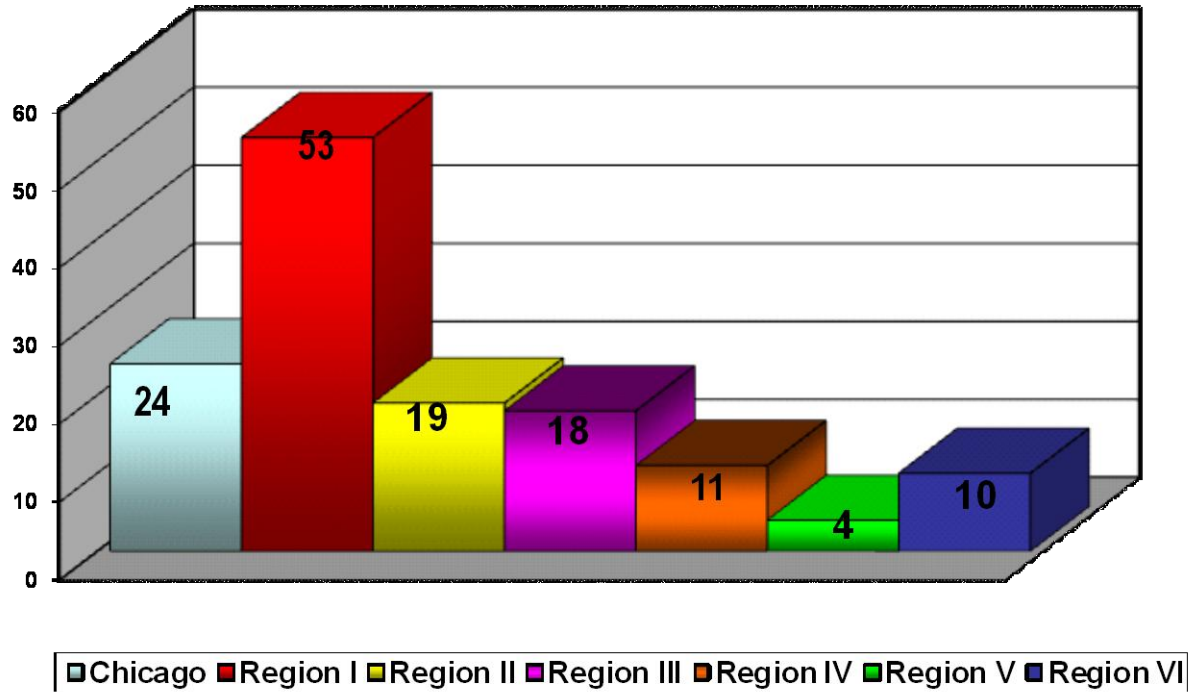

2008-2009 TAKE ONE Candidates by Region (Spring Window 2008 FY 08)

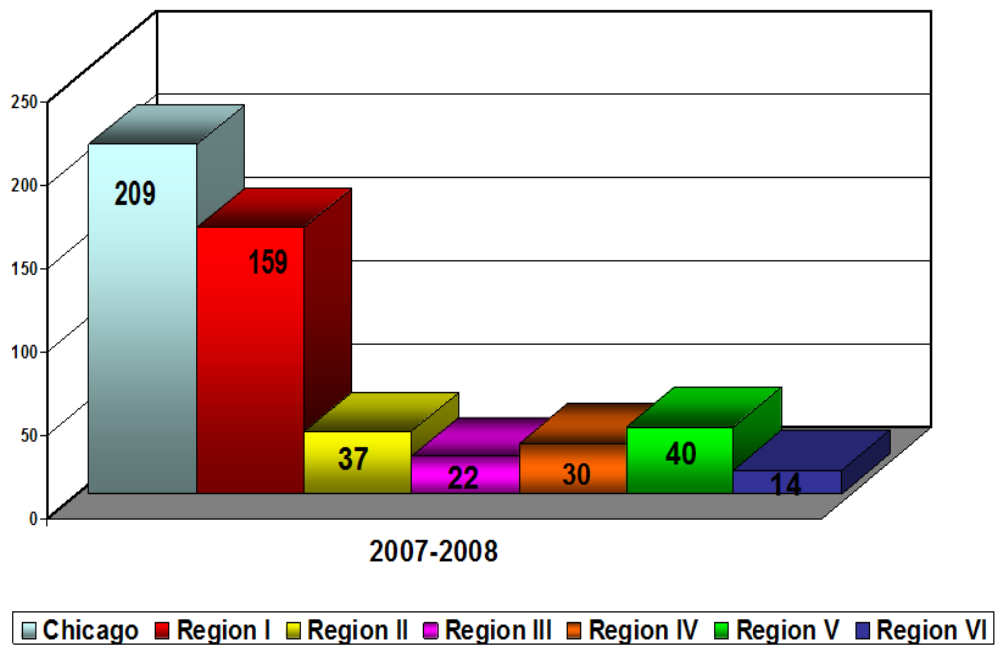

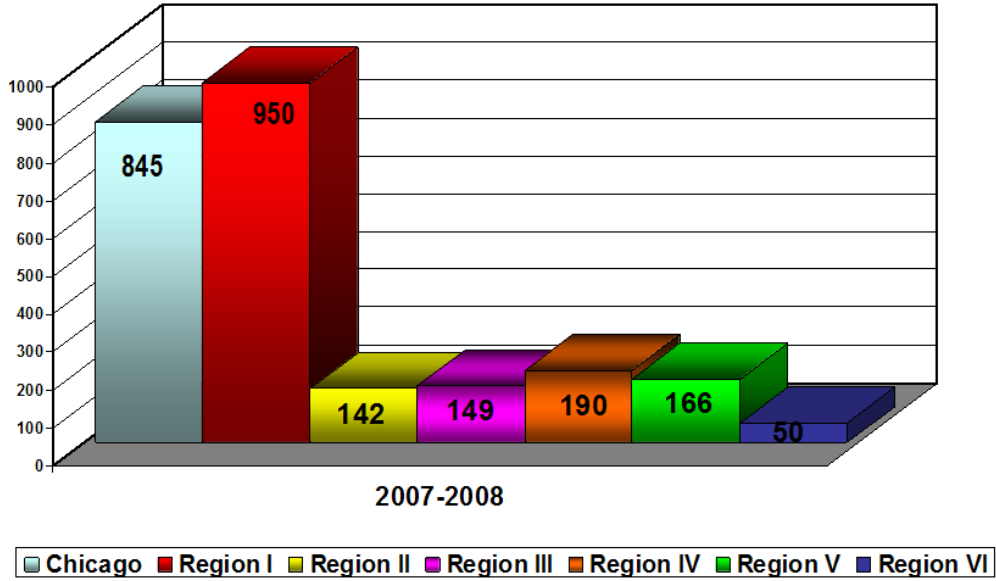
